AUDRINA'S BOUNCY CURLS

Big hair like **Audrina Patridge's** luxe mane of tendrils adds sophistication because it brings to mind Old Hollywood glamour. But to make it modern, keep the look touchable and soft, says Oribe Hair Care celeb stylist Adam Livermore. To do, Adam says first spray dry hair with heat protectant. Then divide hair into one- to two-inch sections. Starting a little below the roots and using a large-barrel curling iron, wrap hair around the barrel section by section to create ringlets. Secure each curl to the head with a bobby pin. Once you've finished curling hair, let it cool; then unclip the curls. Flip your head over, and brush underneath to create volume. To finish, spritz root-lifting hairspray for added hold and to keep the finished product looking polished.

The longer you keep curls pinned, the longer the finished look will last.

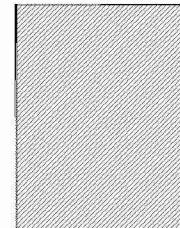

2 RACHEL'S BOMBSHELL HAIR

Rachel McAdams' do is a nod to **Brigitte Bardot's** signature coif. The sultry look is great if you want to try an oversize half-updo without looking like a beauty queen. To get this look, start with 80 percent damp hair and work in mousse to build body. Blow out hair, drying in sections with a big round brush. Don't worry if it gives your hair a ton of bounce – that's the point! Next, take a three-inch section of hair from above your forehead, and place the brush underneath while blowing hair back with the nozzle pointing down (this creates the best volume). Then pin this front hair into a mini bouffant using bobby pins. To finish the look, add texturizing spray to just the ends for a fresh twist on a classic hairstyle.

3 ANNALYNNE'S OVERSIZE BUN

There's a way for every woman to wear big hair. **AnnaLynne McCord's** amazing bone structure and chiseled cheeks really complement her big ballerina bun. To start, secure dry hair in a sleek ponytail at the crown of your head. Next, apply pomade to the pony for texture (be careful not to add to roots or it can look greasy). Using a brush, tease the hair off the ponytail starting around the outside and working your way to the center. Next, tilt your chin down until your hair falls down around your face; take one-inch sections, and roll each under, and pin. Lightly mist with a superfine hairspray. Adam promises, "It's actually easy because it doesn't have to be perfect to be pretty!"
